Eligibility Criteria for members of the Board - from the Articles of Government

Staff and students

- 1. A person under the age of 18 can only be a student member
- 2. A person who is a member of staff (other than the Principal) can only be a staff member
- 3. A student employed by the College as a student union official can only be a student member
- 4. A student of the College can only be a student member
- 5. A member of staff (except 3 above) who is enrolled as a part-time student may only be appointed as a staff member
- 6. A member of the Board who enrols on a full-time course ceases to be a member of the Board

<u>Clerk</u>

7. The Clerk may not be a member

Financial background

- 8. A person may not be a member if they:
 - a. have been adjudged bankrupt or
 - are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order, interim bankruptcy restrictions order or a bankruptcy restrictions undertaking or;
 - c. They have made a composition or arrangement with creditors, including an individual voluntary arrangement
- 9. The disqualification in point 8 above ceases on discharge (see Articles for relevant date.)
- 10. For 8.c disqualification ceases on the date on which payment is completed and in any other cases ceases three years from the date the terms are fulfilled.

Criminal convictions

- 11.A person may not be a member if
 - a. Within the previous five years, or since appointment they have been convicted in the UK or elsewhere of any offence and received a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of three months or more without the option of a fine
 - b. Within the previous 20 years , convicted as set out above, and received a sentence of imprisonment for a period of more than two and a half years; or
 - c. That person has at any time been convicted as set out in paragraph(a) and has received a sentence of imprisonment of five years or more.

Charity Commission – Disqualifications for trustees

Unspent convictions

- 1. An offence involving dishonesty or deception
- 2. for specified terrorism offences
- 3.specified money laundering offence
- 4. specified bribery offence
- 5. an offence contravening a Charity Commission Order or Direction

6. for offences of misconduct in a public office, perjury or perverting the course of justice

7. Aiding attempting or abetting the above offences

Other convictions

- 8. being on the sex offenders register
- 9. unspent sanction for contempt of court
- 10.disobeying a Commission Order
- 11.being a designated persons (under specific anti-terrorist legislation)

<u>Financial</u>

- 12.Insolvency
- 13.being a person who has been removed from a relevant office
- 14.director disqualification
