

Welsh Government Learning Grant for FE (WGLG)

The WGLG is an income-assessed grant of up to £1,500 for a full time course or up to £750 for a part time course depending on your household income.

Annual household income	Part-time (275-499 hours)	Full-time (500+ hours)
Up to £6,120	£750	£1,500
£6,121 - £12,235	£450	£750
£12,236 - £18,370	£300	£450
£18,371 and above	£0	£0

The grant is paid termly to students studying full or part time courses and can help with course costs such as books, equipment, kit and childcare costs.

To qualify for the WGLG grant

- your household income must be £18,370 or less
- your course must be at least 275 hours
- be at a participating college
- lead to a nationally recognised qualifian

The household income details you need to provide will depend on whether you are dependent or an independent student.

If you are already receiving WGLG, provided you are progressing on your course you won't have to reapply but will need to sign a new Learning Agreement.

Student Finance will write to you asking if you are continuing with your course and if any of your details have changed. If you haven't received a new Award Letter by the end of June, please contact them on **0300 200 4050** and advise them you are continuing with your studies. When you receive a new Award Letter keep it safe until the College ask to see it.

When can I apply?

June 2020 - send your completed EMA application with original evidence by this date to ensure that your funding is in place by the start of your course.

31 August 2021 - this is the final date Student Finance will accept your application for you to be eligible for EMA in academic year 2020 to 2021.
